But first, let us make a humble confession of our sins to almighty God.

Sermon - John 6:60-71 - The Words of Eternal Life

Why do people leave particular churches? Often they don't like the minister, or his style, maybe they don't get on with the others in the congregation, maybe they think other church members are hypocrites who say one thing with their mouths, but living the complete opposite when they are outside the church's walls. Often they just drift away from church, like in the parable of the weeds where the busyness of this life, the worries of this world, crowd out God's word, until they just leave the church completely.

In our gospel today, People who had been following Jesus were leaving him. The passage gives a number of reasons why they were leaving. Many were saying that Jesus's teaching was hard. It seems they were referring, possibly amongst other things, to verse 54 where Jesus said: 54 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day." It isn't surprising that his Jewish listeners found this teaching difficult. We pretty much take eating the bread and drinking the wine at Holy Communion for granted, and at least Anglicans and other Protestants understand that we spiritually eat and drink. But you can imagine if I were to stand up in front of you and say that you had to eat my flesh and to drink my blood, that you would have difficulty if you took it literally. I would also have difficulty, as I'm currently quite attached to my body and blood, and I wouldn't be comfortable with you making a meal of me or having a glass of what the blood donation ads used to call my finest red. I'm a bit squeamish even about blood pudding, and I know I couldn't face fresh blood, so I understand that it is a hard teaching.

Today, people continue to find Jesus's words difficult. They say they can't line up Jesus's words with what they 'know' from science, or from what the world around them is telling them. In many cases it is probably because they don't carefully and respectfully read their Bibles with the wisdom that God the Holy Spirit has given them. So it is not surprising that the words are difficult to understand. In other cases, God uses the sin that is in people's hearts to obscure his words because they were never meant to understand. I would also suggest that if this is the case, that these people have decided in their own hearts that they are not be willing to listen, and would reject God, no matter how clear the message is.

For Jesus's Jewish followers it was even worse than just finding Jesus's words difficult. John tells us that Jesus's words offended them. The Jewish would not even go a good rare steak, dripping with blood as it supposed be. For Jesus to suggest that they needed to consume his body and blood would quite rightly

have offended them. For a pious Jew, the mere suggestion that they should consume life blood, let alone human blood, would be absolutely abhorrent.

Today, people find many other reasons to be offended with Jesus's words. They think that they are basically good people, or not as bad as others who deserve judgment. They don't think anyone has to do anything for them to be accepted into eternal life, and quite frankly they are offended that anyone would suggest otherwise, that that they needed Jesus to die for them and rise again

Ultimately, Jesus says that these people do not believe his words. They did not believe that they would have to share in Jesus's body and blood, even though his flesh counts for nothing, as they would see when Jesus ascends to be with the father. They did not believe because they would never believe his words, even though they are the words of Spirit and of truth. Jesus says that he has known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him, and John specifically points to the disciple Judas Iscariot, although even he did not desert Jesus at that point.

People's sin, and their pride so often stands between them and Jesus. They claim it is too difficult, or that the words are offensive to them, or that they just don't believe. In practical terms, God the Father has not enabled them, or at least not yet enabled them. As John notes, from this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. They rejected his words and they rejected Jesus, just as many do today.

When we compare these reasons with the reasons people give today for leaving the church, the reasons that Jesus gives here are all about Jesus's words - unlike the reasons that people actually give today: they don't like the minister, or his style, or they don't get on with the others in the congregation; they think other church members are hypocrites, or the worries of this world. These may seem like they are not about Jesus's words, but when you think about it, they are often reflections of the way the church lives out Jesus words, not just how they verbally proclaim Jesus's words.

While very rarely today will people use the excuse that they don't believe Jesus's words for them stopping coming to church, they might leave if the churches they go to have stopped preaching God's word. It is a good reason to stop being a member of a particular church if it stops preaching God's word from the pulpit, and my earnest prayer is that this will never happen in this church.. I also pray that this is not a church that stops proclaiming God's word in its members' lives - the lives of the preacher and of the congregation.

If these are the seasons that people give for stopping coming to church, what are the reasons they should stay? Verses 66-69 are my favourite verses in the Bible. Let me read them again: 66 From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. Jesus asked the Twelve "You do not want to leave too, do you?". 68 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. 69 We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

Despite the persecutions they knew they would suffer, despite the inconveniences that following Jesus would bring them, like interfering Peter from looking after his aging mother-in-law. Despite the ridicule they would get from the religious and civil authorities of their day, to say nothing of their family, friends and neighbours, and even despite the conflicts within the church, the sinful jockeying for positions of authority, and the plain sinfulness that would still seek to corrupt the church, Simon Peter knew that Jesus has the words of eternal life, that only Jesus has those words, and he believes them. He knew that he had nowhere else to go.

Jesus says that our concerns regarding the difficulty of his teaching about eating his body and drinking his blood will melt away when we appreciate that he has bodily ascended into heaven, once the disciples see him ascend to where he was before, to heaven alongside his Father.

He says that his words are full of Spirit and life and of life. They are not just human words, but words directly from God, imparted and interpreted by the Holy Spirit, the same Holy Spirit who convicts us of the source and truth of God's word, God the Father who enables us to understand and believes his word.

Ultimately, Peter's response resonates, at least with me. Simon Peter answered Jesus, in words that I can only repeat: , "Lord, to whom else shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. 69 We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

Do you also have no where else to go? Have you come to believe and know that Jesus is the Holy One of God, intending to live out that truth to eternal life, or are you, like Judas, and so many of Jesus disciples, one who will betray Jesus?
