# Isaiah 60.1-6

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# Matthew 2.1-12

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Epiphany was celebrated while I was away but I really wanted to finish the Christmas story with you and set the scene for this season of Epiphany so I am cheating just a tiny bit.

If you remember our Christian calendar starts the year with Advent, up to Christmas, then after the Christmas season is over at Epiphany, we celebrate Epiphany until Lent. During the season of we use green as our liturgical colour.

'Epiphaneia' means shining forth, manifestation or revelation. After 1600 years of history, in our lifetime, Western Churches have caught up with the Eastern churches' emphasis on this season. We have always emphasised Christmas and treated the arrival of the wise men as a supplementary story in that season. There is a whole other season after Christmas, after the Christmas tree has come down, to explore the meaning of Christ's coming.



The season of Epiphany begins with a star and ends with Jesus' transfiguration on a mountain. Here we see the starry host and the high places of pagan worship put on notice, with every sacred order of ancient near Eastern Cosmology shown where the real sacred lies. Hence not only the tame star in today gospel, but in our Psalm, we also have the sun and moon subject to him, plus the watering of the earth which was considered the job of Baal and the whole realm of oceans and distant pagan places, and everything else, all come under the power of our God.

There was a long tradition associating the Messiah and star. The star thus forms a common ground, binding together pagan astronomers and Jewish biblical promises. The star of Epiphany is a bad omen for Herod. History's tide is turning. The announcement made by gentiles and triggers the conflict of the kingdoms of earth against the kingdom of heaven, which dominates Matthew's gospel.



In those days, people, particularly in countries to the East of Palestine, had developed the study of the stars and the planets to a fine art. They believed that the whole world was of a piece; everything was

interconnected, and when something important was happening on earth you could expect to see it reflected among in the heavens. Therefore, a remarkable event among the stars and planets must mean, they thought, a remarkable event on earth. So, when thoughtful astronomers or astrologers (the two went together in those days) noticed strange events in the heavens, they would search out their earthly cause. God can use people's search for the truth, even when mistaken, to lead them to the truth.



The wise men's question to Herod and Herod's question to the

teachers of the law was 'where would the baby be born?' What is Matthew wanting us to see? The prophecy in Micah, which we read a week or so before Christmas and is what these teachers of the law found to answer Herod, said that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem but as an adult Jesus was known as a Nazarene, so people thought he couldn't be the Messiah.

The arrival of the Magi introduces us to something which Matthew wants us to be clear about from the start. Jesus being the king of the Jews doesn't mean that he is king of only the Jews. At the heart of many prophesies about the Messiah, were predictions that his rule would bring God's justice and peace to the whole world, so here, even when Jesus is an apparently unknown baby, there is a sign of what is to come. The wise men come as pagans, who though they do not have the special revelation of the torah, come to Jerusalem following the light they have seen.

These men are often depicted as kings but nowhere in our reading does it say that; they were scholars, and wealthy and thus able to travel, and the only reason we think there were three of them is because of the three gifts but there might have been any number. They also started their journey when Jesus was born and travelled a long way, so arrived in Bethlehem years after Jesus' birth, when the census was long over, and the family were living in a house. These details are not important, but it is important to notice that they came seeking the true king.

The gifts the wise men brought, besides being a fulfilment of the prophecy, were the sort of things people in the ancient world would think of as appropriate to bring to kings or even gods. Gold is obviously suitable, but frankincense and myrrh are expensive aromatic gum resins, not native to Palestine, with a variety of religious and medical connotations. There is no evidence that Matthew was thinking in terms of Gold for kingship, frankincense for divinity and myrrh for death but many people have seen it as prophetic.



Have you even noticed that in this story God is never actually mentioned? We don't notice as we read it as his fingerprints are all over it. Like the star motif, the dream portrays God, as being active

unobtrusively but unambiguously behind the scenes. The story shows that, although Jesus comes a the Jewish Messiah , the advent of Christ is the fullfillment of Gentile hopes as well. Even those who do not have the bible and the tradition to know what they are looking for are still in quest of aithentic life and human community.



We should not minimize the wise men's actions, for they did not simply admire or study the star but followed it even to the point of resisting the enthroned powers. Yet their action is a response to the

divine initiative, here, as always, God's grace proceeds human action.

Even if in this day and age some people might be dubious that God would divert a star, no one with any faith doubts God's ability to realign human hearts. The wise men perfectly illustrate the impact of Christ's epiphany on the nations, as they return to their own country by another road.




This choice of another road for humanity is also Paul's theme in Ephesians, with its emerging theology of a universal Church embodying God's mission to all nations, fulfilling Israel's calling.

Paul picks up this theme saying: <sup>6</sup> This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus.

Although Paul came to Christ late, not during Jesus' lifetime but later on the road to Damascus, he fully embraced his mission and never took for granted the grace that had been given to him: <sup>8</sup> Although I am less than the least of all the Lord's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, <sup>9</sup> and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things

As we live our lives, following our Lord Jesus, it is of no account how we got there. It doesn't matter if we came to Him through being brought to church by our parents, an evangelist, or because we were seeking the truth in our own way, the truth is the Jesus revealed himself to us. What matters is that we continue to follow him and live our lives giving our all for his kingdom. In him and through



faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence.

In our reading today, at the beginning of Matthew's gospel we see the mission to all nations, which will also close the gospel. Matthew is saying: listen to the whole story: Think about what it meant for Jesus to be the true king of the Jews. And then - come to him, by whatever route you can, and with the best gift you can find.
