³⁰ The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all they had done and taught. ³¹ Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." ³² So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place. ³³ But many who saw them leaving recognized them and ran on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. ³⁴ When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a

shepherd. So he began teaching them many things. ³⁵ By this time it was late in the day, so his disciples came to him. "This is a remote place," they said, "and it's already very late. ³⁶ Send the people away so that they can go to the surrounding countryside and villages and buy themselves something to eat." ³⁷ But he answered, "You give them something to eat." They said to him, "That would take more than half a year's wages! Are we to go and spend that much on bread and give it to them to eat?" ³⁸ "How many loaves do you have?" he asked. "Go and see." When they found out, they said, "Five—and two fish." ³⁹ Then Jesus directed them to have all the people sit down in groups on the green grass. ⁴⁰ So they sat down in groups of hundreds and fifties. ⁴¹ Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to his disciples to distribute to the people. He also divided the two fish among them all. ⁴² They all ate and were satisfied, ⁴³ and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces of bread and fish. ⁴⁴ The number of the men who had eaten was five thousand. ⁴⁵ Immediately Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. ⁴⁶ After leaving them, he went up on a mountainside to pray. ⁴⁷ Later that night, the boat was in the middle of the lake, and he was alone on land. ⁴⁸ He saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. Shortly before dawn he went out to them, walking on the lake. He was about to pass by them, ⁴⁹ but when they saw him walking on the lake, they thought he was a ghost. They cried out, ⁵⁰ because they all saw him and were terrified. Immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." ⁵¹Then he climbed into the boat with them, and the wind died down. They were completely amazed, ⁵² for they had not understood about the loaves; their hearts were hardened. ⁵³ When they had crossed over, they landed at Gennesaret and anchored there. ⁵⁴ As soon as they got out of the boat, people recognized Jesus. ⁵⁵ They ran throughout that whole region and carried the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was.

⁵⁶ And wherever he went—into villages, towns or countryside—they placed the sick in the marketplaces. They begged him to let them touch even the edge of his cloak, and all who touched it were healed.

Sermon - Jesus and Miracles Question Time

The Nicene Creed

Sermon - The Kingdom of God - Mark 4:1-33

Have you ever been watching a movie, when something comes from out of the blue, and all you can think of is "Where did that come from?"

Do you remember the 1979 Peter Sellers film "Being There"? In it, a simple-minded gardener Chance (played by Peter Sellers) has spent all his life in the home of an old man. When the man dies, Chance is put out on the street with no knowledge of the world except what he has learned from television. He becomes an unlikely political insider, and appears on a television talk show during which his detailed advice about what a serious gardener should do is misunderstood as his opinion on presidential policy. The film ends at Chauncey's benefactor's funeral where power brokers discuss nominating Chauncey for vice president. Chauncey just wanders off to a pond, and walks across the water, with the final line - Life is just a state of mind.

Filmgoers have been arguing ever since what the scene means. Some people suggest that Chauncey was just so innocent he didn't know he couldn't walk on water, so he just did it. Others think he was some kind of guardian angel, others that Chauncey was some sort of a Jesus figure. At the end of the day it is a movie, and you are fully entitled to make your own mind up as to what it means for you.

I remembered this scene because of today's reading, in which we heard that Jesus walked on water. It says 45 Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. 46 After leaving them, he went up on a mountainside to pray. 47 Later that night, the boat was in the middle of the lake, and he was alone on land. 48 He saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. Shortly before dawn he went out to them, walking on the lake.

As I read this, I wondered why Jesus performed this miracle. All the other miracles that Jesus performed benefited people in some way. People were healed, raised from the dead and fed when they had no food. Even in Jesus's first miracle, the bride's family was saved from social embarrassment when Jesus turned water into wine.

But what did walking on the water achieve, apart from getting him to the other side of the lake? The disciples were straining at the oars, but it doesn't sound like he saved them - he could just as easily have calmed the waves from the shore. It sounds a bit like he was just showing off!

As we read on, we are told: They were completely amazed, 52 for they had not understood about the loaves; their hearts were hardened. Obviously there was significant meaning to the miracle, and it was somehow related to the feeding of the 5000, but the hard hearts of the disciples were not able to understand it.

So, let's work our way through the passage, and see what other clues we are given.

Sheep without a Shepherd

Back in verse 34 we are told: When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, **he had compassion on them**, **because they were like sheep without a shepherd**. So he began teaching them many things.

You or I might have missed this, but this comment, the crowd being like sheep without a shepherd, is actually a quote from the Old Testament.

In Numbers 27:16 and 17 Moses asks God: "May the LORD, the God who gives breath to all living things, appoint someone over this community **17** to go out and come in before them, one who will lead them out and bring them in, so the LORD's people will not be like sheep without a shepherd."

Moses was asking God to provide a successor who would shepherd Israel after he had died, after the Exodus. Also, in Ezekiel 34 God also says that the human shepherds over Israel have been a major disappointment, and will be removed because they are corrupt, with God himself taking on the job. God would be shepherd over this people without a shepherd.

Feeding the 5000

As we go on with Jesus feeding the 5000, we also get another Old Testament image. Can anyone guess which one I am talking about?

As we know, the great moment in Israel's history was the Exodus from Egypt under the leadership of Moses. Pharaoh has placed the Israelites under harsh slavery, and God sent 10 plagues to convince Pharaoh to let them go. He eventually did, and they wandered in the wilderness, running out of bread and meat. God miraculously provided manna and quail in the wilderness, as we read in our Old Testament reading today.

To Jesus's Jewish followers, the link would have been unmistakeable - the events were re-enacting Israel being saved from slavery in Egypt - Jesus was doing what God had done generations previously.

Walking on Water

This brings us to Jesus walking on water. This also would have reminded the Jews of that other great water miracle during the Exodus - the parting of the Red Sea.While Jesus didn't part the Red Sea like God did for Moses, he walked over the lake dry shod as the Israelites did when escaping Egypt.

Then, to confirm the allusion even further, when Jesus gets into the boat he tells them "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid"

The little phrase "it is I' or more literally "I am I" was a clear reference to God's special name that we know as Yahweh, or Jehovah.

When Moses was called by God to lead the Israelites out of Egypt at the burning bush that was not burning up, he asked God in Exodus 3, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"

14 God said to Moses, "I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I am has sent me to you.'"

It is possible that Jesus was just telling the disciples "It's me", but often, when Jesus said "It is I', the Jewish leaders got very upset. For example in Matthew 9, Jesus asks "Do you believe that I am able to heal the blind men?" This led the Pharisees to say: "It is by the prince of demons that he drives out demons."

And in Mark 14, the high priest asked him, "Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?" **62** "I am," said Jesus. "And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and coming on the clouds of heaven." **63** The high priest tore his clothes. "Why do we need any more witnesses?" he asked. **64** "You have heard the blasphemy. What do you think?" They all condemned him as worthy of death.

So often, when Jesus uses the phrase I am, we are supposed to think about God's special name Yahweh, and whether it is a reference to Jesus's divinity.

Conclusion

So, again and again, Jesus is comparing his ministry with God's ministry in the Old Testament, and particularly during the Exodus from Egypt. His miracles reflect the miracles that God did, and even his language reflects God's language - particularly with God's special name Yahweh, or I am.

Even the name that Gabriel gave to Mary to name him before he was born, Jesus means God Saves.

Jesus certainly saw his ministry as beinb to save his people from slavery to sin and death. As he said in John 8: "Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. **35** Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. **36** So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

Also, as we read in our reading from Hebrews: 1 We must pay the most careful attention, therefore, to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away. 2 For since the message spoken through angels was binding, and every violation and disobedience received its just punishment, 3 how shall we escape if we ignore so great a salvation? This salvation, which was first announced by the Lord, was confirmed to us by those who heard him. 4 God also testified to it by signs, wonders and various miracles, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will.

In former times, God saved the Israelites by signs, miracles and wonders from harsh slavery to Egypt.

Now Jesus testifies by his signs, wonders and miracles to salvation from just punishment of sin.

He shows that he is not only Lord of creation, walking on water and calming the sea. He providing food miraculously, he shows, as we have seen previously that he is Lord over life itself, saving us from slavery to sin and death and raising us up to eternal life.

And so we must pay the most careful attention to Jesus, 'God Saves' the Lord of Salvation, so we do not drift away from a salvation, greater even that the salvation he won for the Israelites from slavery to Egypt, the salvation fro the slavery to death by sin.

Are you paying careful attention?
