¹³ As Jesus was leaving the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher! What massive stones! What magnificent buildings!" 2 "Do you see all these great buildings?" replied Jesus. "Not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down." ³ As Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John and Andrew asked him privately, 4 "Tell us, when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are all about to be fulfilled?" 5 Jesus said to them: "Watch out that no one deceives you. 6 Many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am he,' and will deceive many. 7 When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed. Children will rebel against their parents and have them put to death. ¹³ Everyone will hate you because of me, but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved. ¹⁴"When you see 'the abomination that causes desolation' standing where it does not belong—let the reader understand—then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains. 15 Let no one on the housetop go down or enter the house to take anything out. 16 Let no one in the field go back to get their cloak. 17 How dreadful it will be in those days for pregnant women and nursing mothers! 18 Pray that this will not take place in winter, ¹⁹ because those will be days of distress unequaled from the beginning, when God created the world, until now—and never to be equaled again. ²⁰ "If the Lord had not cut short those days, no one would survive. But for the sake of the elect, whom he has chosen, he has shortened them. ²¹ At that time if anyone says to you, 'Look, here is the Messiah!' or, 'Look, there he is!' do not believe it. 22 For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and perform signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect. ²³ So be on your guard; I have told you everything ahead of time. ²⁴ "But in those days, following that distress, " 'the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; 25 the stars will fall from the sky, and the heavenly bodies will be shaken.' ²⁶ "At that time people will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. 27 And he will send his angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of the heavens.

Sermon - Lest we forget - Mark 12:41-14:11

On Thursday we remembered ANZAC Day. Some people went to a Dawn Service, some people participated in, or watched an ANZAC Day march, some people played two-up and some people just quietly reflected. We marked the landings in Gallipoli of Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC) soldiers in 1915, and commemorate all who served and died in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations. We reflected on their courage, discipline and self-sacrifice.

Up until the 1940s, what we know as World War 1 was known as the Great War, the war to end all wars. Unfortunately, World War II put an end to that thinking. Even the great war could not prevent evil men perpetrating war again. Around 10 million soldiers dead of wounds or disease, as many as 13 million non-combatant civilians killed. 23 million military personnel injured.

It is foolishness to think that humans could stop war with a war, but people keep on trying, and conflicts are always with us.

In our gospel reading this morning, Jesus is more realistic about war. He knows that the only time war will cease will be the last days, when he returns to judge the world and sin is completely, finally destroyed. Up until then conflict will continue, and Jesus talks about two periods of conflict: the conflict leading to the destruction of the temple in AD70, and the birth pains leading up to the end times, when he will return and restore this world to the way God intended.

Scholars argue about which verses in our reading refer to which period, but I am of the view that verses 5 through 23 talk about the period leading up to and including the destruction of the Temple in AD70, and verses 24 through 35 are about the end times.

The Destruction of the Temple

So let's quickly look at these conflicts. So firstly, let's look at verses 5 through 23, the destruction of the temple and events leading up to it. The destruction of the temple in Jerusalem, in 70AD under the Roman Emperor Titus was extremely traumatic for the Jewish people. For them, the temple symbolised God's presence. If God were to allow it to be destroyed, did this mean God had abandoned his people? Worse still, could it mean that God had been defeated by the gods of the Romans?

The disciples couldn't believe the magnificent temple in front of them could be destroyed, and ask Jesus When? Jesus answers in verse 5 following, saying to them: 7 When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to

come. 8 Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places, and famines. These are the beginning of birth pains.

There have certainly been wars and rumours of wars ever since Jesus said those words. From the Jewish wars that led to the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem in AD70, to the current major conflicts in Palestine, Ukraine, Burma, Northern Africa and Sudan. Historians say there has never been a period in recent history when there hasn't been at least one major international conflict. Jesus tells us not to be alarmed about wars, the end is still to come. This is true whether Jesus is talking about the end of the temple, or the end of days.

He said that leading up to AD70, many would claim they are Jesus, and would deceive many. Historically we know of many who claimed to be the Messiah, or Christ in the first century, and we still have them - people claiming to be Jesus because of mental illness or their own selfish reasons.

There were also wars and rumours of wars, just as there are today. Despite these, Jesus says do not be alarmed, the end is still to come. These wars, rumours of wars, earthquakes, famines and hate crimes against Christians are merely the beginning of birth pains.

Despite being the father of 4 children, and being present at each of their births, there are people here today who are much more qualified than I am to talk about birth pains, with much more direct experience. My wife has made it abundantly clear to me that a baby's birth involves a lot of physical pain. However, assuming nothing goes sadly wrong, we all know the baby will be born sooner or later. Jesus is saying that there will be a lot of pain, including the destruction of the temple before the last days, his followers should see them as prompts for us to be prepared for Jesus' return on the last days.

The Last Days

This brings us to the end of days. Jesus says "the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; 25 the stars will fall from the sky, and the heavenly bodies will be shaken."

This is a prophecy from Isaiah 13, where God goes on to say 11 I will punish the world for its evil, the wicked for their sins. I will put an end to the arrogance of the haughty and will humble the pride of the ruthless. 13 Therefore I will make the heavens tremble; and the earth will shake from its place at the wrath of the Lord Almighty, on the day of his burning anger.

Following these calamitous events in the skies, the sure sign of the final days is that 26 "At that time people will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. 27 And he will send his angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth

to the ends of the heavens. This wasn't new to Jesus, it had been prophesied 700 years before by the prophet Daniel.

Jesus will return in the clouds and will gather all Christians to eternal life, as 1 Thessalonians 4 tells us: 16 the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever.

Despite the signs, Jesus says: 32 "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 33 Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come.

The conflicts will continue until Jesus returns. Everyone will hate us because of Jesus, but everyone who stands firm to the end will be saved. Standing firm during the conflicts won't be easy, but if we do, we have the absolute confidence of eternal life in the perfect heaven that God has prepared for us.

Today, it is helpful for us to think of one of our forebears who proudly served his country in the great war.

Reginald Samuel Thorn grew up in Cavanaugh, South Australia, but grew up in Broken Hill, where he became a school teacher and principal. After hearing the news of Gallipoli, he joined the 10th Battalion of the 7th Brigade of the AIF on 31 August 1915. On the second day of the Battle of Pozieres, Reg was killed by a sniper. He gave everything for his family and country.

The day before the battle, he had written a letter to his mother, which is preserved in the Australian War memorial. It reads:

My darling mother

We are on the eve of a very great battle, and no man of us knows whether or not he may be in this world this time tomorrow. This may therefore be my final farewell here, but I know that God will support you whatever befalls. We have no fear, and we should all be thankful to possess the assurance we have that our partings here are only temporary and that we shall at last meet in a better and a happier world. Should any of our own fall, do not grieve for us, but be thankful that our own rest has come, as will that for us all sooner or later, and when we meet again our present trials will seem quite insignificant compared with the future joy.

Remember, darling mother, that our own end should be fall will most likely be unconscious and hence painless, and although we have seen the awfulness of the worst part of the battlefields, we go without fear

Commending loved ones at home, who are called to the great sacrifice of loved ones to God's merciful care. Remember his sacrifice for us.

Reg stayed firm until the end of his earthly life. He remained firm to his mother, his brother, his country, and most importantly, to his faith in Jesus Christ, and Jesus's sacrifice for us that we might have eternal life in a better and happier world, a world without the conflicts that have been part and parcel of this world ever since the serpent brought sin into our world, and a world whose joys will make the trials and conflicts of this world seem entirely insignificant.

Let us, like Reg, wait, watch, be on guard, and stand firm to the end and be saved to at last meet in a better and a happier world.
