Sermon - Acts 8 - Taking The Opportunities that God Gives

Are you a procrastinator? Do you take forever to start a job that you really know you need to do? When I was still working in my previous secular job, I was leading and preaching in a small church every couple of weeks, but usually wouldn't finish writing the sermon until early on the Sunday morning a few hours before the services. I used to say that I work best under a bit of pressure, but in reality it was probably that I had procrastinated so much during the week that I only started writing the sermon on Saturday night when I couldn't possibly wait any longer. Needless to say, both my sermons, and my ministry on Sunday mornings suffered as a result.

Do you ever find that circumstances push you to do things that you know you should have been doing all along?

The early believers know their mission was to preach the gospel to all nations. Before Jesus had ascended to heaven he had told the believers to remain in Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit came, and they had done this, but Jesus had also told them in Acts 1:8 "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

We heard 6 weeks ago how the Holy Spirit had come on the day of Pentecost, and every week since we have been hearing how the gospel was being preached in Jerusalem. But why wasn't it going out to <u>all</u> Judea, Samaria or the ends of the earth? It seems the apostles were too busy in the new church and needed a bit of a push. Part of that push came last week when the matter of distributing food to the Greek widows came to a head and Stephen and the other administrators were appointed and a load was taken off the apostles.

But this wasn't enough, and in today's reading there was an even bigger push. We heard last week that one of the new administrators, Stephen, was martyred. This week we heard that a young fellow called Saul approved of Stephen's death, and it prompted him to instigate a huge program of persecution against the church in Jerusalem. Saul sought to destroy the church. Going from house to house, he dragged off both men and women and put them in prison.

Despite the tragedy of this persecution, it was the impetus the church needed to break out of Jerusalem and set foot for the rest of Judea, Samaria, and ultimately, to the ends of the whole world.

You see, because of the persecution, Philip, another of the administrators, went down to a city in Samaria and proclaimed Jesus there. 6 When the crowds heard Philip and saw the signs he performed, they all paid close attention to what he said. 7 For with shrieks, impure spirits came out of many, and many who were paralyzed or lame were healed. 8 So there was great joy in that city.

The gospel was on the move and the church had now made its way to Samaria! People of that particular city believed Philip as he proclaimed the good news of the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptised, both men and women. The apostles who remained back in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, and they sent Peter and John to Samaria. 15 When they arrived, they prayed for the new believers there that they might receive the Holy Spirit, 16 because the Holy Spirit had not yet come on any of them. Peter and John placed their hands on the new believers, and they received the Holy Spirit.

So the Holy Spirit was moving, but it is important to recognise that it wasn't a matter of growth <u>at any cost</u> for the church. The model of church planting was that believers from the church in Jerusalem would plant churches in new towns by preaching the gospel and appointing godly men as leaders before moving on. These leaders were obviously critical to the formation of the new church and had to have impeccable character.

A fellow known as Simon the Sorcerer heard Philip preaching the gospel and really believed. He was baptised and put his hand up for leadership, but he didn't make the cut. While he demonstrated a huge influence, and there was no reason to believe he hadn't truly believed and become a Christian, he thought he could buy leadership in the church with money. This really showed to Peter that he wasn't up to leadership, he was severely rebuked, and disqualified for the job.

After this episode in this city in Samaria, we get to the interesting account of Philip and the Ethiopian. It wasn't read out this morning due to time constraints, but basically an angel told Philip to go south to a certain road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza. Well, we all know where Gaza is today, and Philip was going there. He met an important Ethiopian official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (which means "queen of the Ethiopians"). This man was obviously a convert to Judaism because he had been worshipping in Jerusalem, and was reading

his Bible on the way home. Philip explained to him that the passage he was reading should point him to Christ, and he insisted on getting baptised straight away.

Both Philip and the Ethiopian took advantage of the opportunities that God gave them. Philip noticed that the Ethiopian was reading from scripture, and a very specific prophecy about Jesus to boot, and the Ethiopian noticed that there was water suitable for baptism, and so wanted to be baptised.

Today we have learnt two really important lessons for our church. In the first and the third episode we learnt the importance of taking the opportunities that God gives us. The early Church took advantage of the persecution they had experienced to get on with the job they had been given, and to get on with taking the gospel to Judea, Samaria and the ends of the earth. Members of the church went to Judea and Samaria, and Philip specifically went to Samaria, and by noticing that a Ethiopian in a chariot was reading the Scriptures, started the gospel on its journey to the ends of the earth, and ultimately, we, half a world away in Cooma, are beneficiaries of that journey.

Peter also shows us the importance of the integrity of our leadership in the church. Sure, it's important that churches are established and grow, and charismatic leaders can really help in that. However poor leadership will destroy churches. Our church here in Cooma is looking for long term leadership, and it is absolutely critical that we find the right leadership, even if it takes time.

Learning both lessons was critical for the growth of the early church, and critical for the growth of Cooma Anglican. In the light of what we have learnt from acts 8, let us make the most of every opportunity for the gospel, and through prayer and action, let us ensure we get Godly leadership with integrity.
