Baptism Introduction

This morning we welcome Elsie Colton, her parents and godparents, for Elsie's baptism.

There is one Body and one Spirit; there is one hope in God's call to us.

One Lord, one Faith, one Baptism, one God and Father of all.

Baptism is the gift of our Lord Jesus Christ. When he had risen from the dead, he commanded his followers to go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

We have come together today to obey that command.

Baptism with water signifies the cleansing from sin that Jesus' death makes possible, and the new life that God gives us through the Holy Spirit. In baptism, the promises of God are visibly

signed and sealed for us. We are joined to Christ, and made members of his body, the Church universal.

Children are baptised in response to God's all-embracing love. Parents and godparents who have responded to that love come now to bring their children for baptism. Before this congregation they must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up their children in the faith and practice of the Church. In due time these children should make their own response to God, and be prepared for confirmation.

In confirmation those who have been previously baptised come to confirm their baptismal promises and join with the other candidates to receive the laying on of the bishop's hand with prayer. We pray that those who are baptised and confirmed will be empowered by the Holy Spirit for the ministry and service to which God shall call them.

So we welcome you, Elsie Colton, with your parents and godparents. We give thanks for you, and pray that you may know God's love and faithfulness for ever.

Now, let us affirm our trust in God's mercy, and confess our need for forgiveness.

Lord God, you created this world, and made us in your own image. Forgive us when we turn away from you.

Lord God, through your Son you overcame evil and death. Rescue us from slavery to sin. Christ, have mercy. **Christ, have mercy.**

We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit. **Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph. **Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom. **Thanks be to God.**

And now we give you thanks that you have called Elsie to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism. Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that when Elsie is baptised in it, she may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection. May she die to sin, rise to newness of life, and continue forever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Affirmation of Faith

I ask you now to affirm as yours the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe Jesus Christ, God's only Son, Who was conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Sermon - Psalm 8 - What is man that God is mindful of them

For those visiting today, welcome to the Monaro, one of the most beautiful parts of God's creation!

The quality of an artist is always shown in the beauty of their art, so just by looking around, you must get some idea of the God who has made it all.

The psalmist calls this the majesty of God, and says that God has also demonstrated this majesty, this glory, in the heavens which he also made. They are particularly beautiful in this area, away from the bright city lights, you just have to look up at night.

I never cease to be amazed when I look up and see the brightness of the Milky Way, the moon, the stars and the planets in the heavens above us at night. Scientists estimate there are an estimated 200 billion trillion stars in the universe. This is a number that is so large that it's hard to imagine, but it's about 10 times the number of cups of water in all the oceans of Earth. If it is that impressive, how impressive must be the God who made it all.

Yet, it doesn't take a scientist to appreciate the majesty of the universe, even children and infants are in awe of it. I am sure that Greg and Ali have already experienced the wonder in Elsie's little face as she looks up at night out on their property - even when it is well after she should be asleep! Well, the psalmist says this awe of children and infants silences God's enemies. Despite there being so many who try, who can really speak against the creator of this wonderful universe, particularly a universe as awesome as ours?

Yet, there is something even more amazing to the psalmist.

The psalmist knows that despite making the 200 billion trillion stars, stars varying in size from a the size of city block to half our solar system, he still not only notices, but completely cares about human beings, people who are physically less than dust in the scale of the average star, let alone the universe. Yet, God cares about each and every one of us, from the smallest baby to the eldest grandparent. He cares about every human being individually, no matter who they are or what they have done.

Well may we wonder with the psalmist - ⁴what is mankind that God is mindful of them, human beings that God cares for them?

Despite humans' physical insignificance in the scheme of the universe, in God's scheme, humans are the pinnacle of creation - we are just a little lower than angels, the spiritual beings who are about as impressive as you can get. We know this because every time anyone saw an angel in the Bible they were absolutely terrified. Yet, as awesome as angels appear, only humans are made in

the image of God. Only humans are crowned with glory and honour. Only humans are made to rule over works of God's creation.

As it says in Genesis, the first book of the Bible, it was only to mankind, to Adam, whom God brought all the wild animals and all the birds in the sky, to see what he would name them. Whatever Aman called each living creature, that was its name. It is as the psalmist puts it: it's only humans who God made rulers over the works of his hands; God put everything under their feet:⁷ all flocks and herds, and the animals of the wild, ⁸ the birds in the sky, and the fish in the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas.

More significantly, it is only humans about whom the apostle Paul was able to say in our Ephesians reading this morning: its only humans who can know the hope to which God has called us, the riches of God's glorious inheritance in them, his holy people, ¹⁹ Only these people know his incomparably great power for those who believe.

Paul tells us that the power that is at work in humans who believe is the same as the mighty strength God exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms. Christ, Jesus Christ is God the only Son who came to earth as a perfect human being. He died and rose again for our salvation, and is now far above all rule and authority, power and dominion. He is above every name, not only in the present age but also in the age to come. God has placed all things under Jesus's feet and has appointed him to be head over the church, over all humans who put their trust in him, and who are his body in the world.

It is only humans for whom God sent his son, Jesus Christ, God the Son, to earth as a human being to die on the cross for the forgiveness of our sin that we might gain eternal life in the world that God is even now restoring to the perfection is was always intended to be, free from sin and death and pain, that we might live with him forever.

It is only humans, like you, like me, like even little Elsie, who have this perfect eternal future to look forward to. Her baptism this morning is a sign of this perfect future her parents want for her, and we pray, she will choose for herself when she comes of age.

My prayer this morning is not only that Elsie will make this choice for herself when she is old enough to understand, but so will everyone here put their trust in Jesus and make that choice. In fact, I pray that every human will hear the good news of Jesus and make that choice - to have their rebellion against God forgiven and accept the perfect eternal life he offers, and thus become part of the ultimate demonstration of how majestic in all the earth is the name of our God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Let's remind each other of what our God has done through Jesus for Elsie, and for us. Let's say to each other the final line of the psalm:

O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! Amen
