Sermon - Jesus's Second Coming - Advent 1

Are you the sort of person who starts a project at the beginning or the end? I mean, do you start by considering the materials, the instructions and all the necessary steps required to get the outcome you want, or do you start by envisioning the perfect outcome, and work back to the necessary steps and materials. I was a project manager with defence for many years, and found that when building ships that both approaches have their advantages. You have to have a good idea of what the ship needs to look like and what it needs to do before you start, but you also need to understand the capability and capacity of your ship yard and workforce to build a successful ship. Today as we start advent, we will look at the season of advent in the second way, working from the end to the beginning. From Jesus's second coming to his first coming. However, before we get properly started in this sermon, we need a bit of background on the season of advent.

Who can tell me what advent is about?

Firstly, the word advent is from the Greek word to come, and we celebrate it for the 4 weeks leading up to Christmas. It is literally preparation for Jesus to come.

However, like the person that starts a project by envisioning the finished product, the first week of advent does not look at the beginning, the story of the first Christmas when Jesus came the first time, but to Jesus's second coming when he will return in glory on the last day.

Our gospel reading this morning is just one of many Bible passages that talks about Jesus' return. A key verse is verse 27 which says: At that time they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.

Now I know that scholars have been arguing about the details of Jesus's return ever since he ascended into heaven, so I am not going to confuse you even more this morning by adding my own views. There are more than twenty different passages in the New Testament that say something about Jesus's second coming, and while they don't contradict each other, they have to be read very carefully to understand them. This morning I just want to touch on a couple of aspects that are clear, and some things that the Bible says we cannot know.

The first point is that Jesus will return.

In our gospel reading today, Jesus said that the Son of Man will come in the clouds with glory. Jesus always used the term 'Son of Man' of himself, although it could have other meanings. However, John 14:1-3 is clear. Jesus said "My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, <u>I will come back</u> and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am.' John 14:2-3

In Acts 1:11, two angels in white told the disciples immediately after Jesus ascended into heaven: "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven." Acts 1:11

So, the fact that Jesus will return is without doubt, but the timing is a lot more difficult to understand. In fact, Jesus said that it is impossible for anyone to know when he would return because even he did not know before he ascended to heaven. In Mark's version of our gospel reading this morning, Jesus says that 'about the Son of man returning in the clouds, no one knows that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.' Mark 13:32.

We do know that it is not unreasonable for it to be a long time for Jesus to return. In Peter's second letter, he says that scoffers will come, saying "Where is this 'coming' he promised." Peter says ⁸ But do not forget this one thing, friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. Jesus said "this generation will not pass away until all these things happen.", and I thought Jesus meant that he expected to return before the generation he was talking to had died. This would have been within 80 years or so. Obviously Jesus didn't return then, so He meant either the generation who saw those things beginning to happen would not pass away before he return (in other words, from the start of the signs to the end would happen in one generation), or that the signs will start happening within his generation, but would not necessarily complete. This of course has happened: in his generation there were signs in the sun, moon and stars. Nations were in anguish and perplexity and people were fainting from terror, heavenly bodies were being shaken. These things were happening in Jesus's day, they are still happening, and will keep happening until Jesus returns. They keep happening to remind us that one day, Jesus will in fact return.

You see, God's timing is not out timing, and in his grace, he will ensure everyone will be given the opportunity to hear the gospel, repent and turn to him. As 2 Peter goes on to say: 'The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.' 2 Peter 3:8-9. He is not rushing back so that even more people have the opportunity to gain eternal life. And so, until he returns, Christians have the responsibility to share his good news so that more and more will repent and gain the eternal life he offers.

Another thing that is difficult to be sure of is the specific events when Jesus returns. We know that there will be signs, Jesus will return in glory in the clouds, the dead in Christ will be raised and living Christians will be caught up to meet the Lord in

the air and be with Him forever. We know that those who have died in Christ will have their redeemed souls and spirits united with a body similar to Christ's glorified body; and those who reject Christ will be judged and there will be a new heaven and a new earth, where there will be perfect righteousness. The Bible says these will happen, but I don't pretend to know or understand all that will happen, when, or in what order. I do know that at the end of it all, those who put their trust in Jesus will have eternal life in a Eden-like world with God and worshipping God. I do know that this is not something that we want to miss out on, or have anyone we know and love miss out on, and so we need to be ready.

And this leads us to the final thing that we do know about Jesus's return - how to make sure we are ready.

Luke tells us to "Be careful that your hearts are not weighed down with carousing, drunkenness and the anxieties of life. We are to always be on the watch, and pray that we may be able to stand before Jesus.

1 Timothy tells us to watch our life and doctrine closely, because if we persevere in them, we will be saved. Similarly, Hebrews tells us to persevere, so when we have done the will of God (that is, kept our faith in Jesus), we will receive what he has promised. Jude tells us: build ourselves up in the most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit, ²¹ keep ourselves in God's love as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life. Jude 1:20-21

Ultimately, we are to live with our end, our eternal life in mind. The doctrine that Timothy refers to is salvation by faith, and the alternative is abandoning faith and following deceiving spirits and things taught by demons, works like avoiding marriage, certain foods and other good gifts of God. Works that won't ever make us right with God

Until Jesus returns, we are to keep our faith in his death and resurrection for us. This is the only basis on which we can stand before Jesus, the Son of Man when he returns. We don't know when he will return, or how everything will happen, but today, in the advent of his second coming, we need to remain prepared, trusting in his death and resurrection, and looking forward to the eternal life he promises us through his death and resurrection. Are you prepared?

Amen
