Sermon - 2 Thessalonians 1

This morning I am starting a new sermon series on Paul's Second letter to the church in Thessalonika. You may recall that just after I came to Cooma I preached a series on 1st Thessalonians, back in November 2023. Since then, in the last 14 or so months, I have got to know you, the body of Christ that is Cooma Anglican Church, as Paul got to know more about the church in Thessaloniki between his letters. Like Paul with the church at Thessalonika, and in fact like any pastor with their flock, I ought always to thank God for your growth, brothers and sisters, and in fact, I can honestly say that I do.

Paul thanks God that the Thessalonians' faith is growing more and more, and that the love they all have for one another is increasing. I am sure there has been similar growth in our faith and love across the congregations in this parish. There has been some numerical growth, particularly at St Pauls, but there has also been growth where it really counts, but is harder to accurately assess; growth in faith and love. Before I arrived, Wendy boasted to me that she had never felt as loved and supported in a parish as she felt at Cooma. For me, since I have been here, the faith expressed through your commitment to each other, in our conversations, through your questions asked after sermons, and the love shown in the fellowship we share, including during morning teas after services, are all evidence of the growth in your faith and love.

Paul knew that he had particular cause to boast about the Thessalonian faith. He knew, even though he wasn't with them, that they were persevering even in many persecutions and trials that they were enduring. We can thank God that we do not have to endure much persecution in the same way for our faith in Cooma. Many of us have suffered on a personal level through sickness or personal loss, and in some cases have lost relationships, even in your families and friends, and in some cases employment opportunities because of the importance to you of being members of Christ's body. Nevertheless, it is hard to compare this to the violence, the prejudice and outright persecution that we know the Thessalonians endured in the first century. However, in your trials, and despite your apparent lack of trials, I am pleased to see that you still persevere, like the Thessalonians.

2 Thessalonians takes an interesting turn in verse 5, when Paul says that the Thessalonians' perseverance through persecutions is evidence or proof of God's righteous judgment. He is saying that the affliction of the believers through

persecution, is part of God's judgment, and that it is right and just. But how can the persecution of Christians be right and just?

I know it doesn't sit well with many of you, but Paul is saying our persecutions and trials are not only right and just, but they are allowed by God. God lets us suffer persecution so that we will be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, for which we are suffering. Paul is saying that God is so much in control of things that even the hostile and sinful acts of unbelievers in persecuting Christians are part of God's holy and just judgment. Our completely righteous God really governs the acts of sinful people, but he himself does not become sinful. Don't get Paul wrong, the persecution of Christians is sin; but in the wise and sovereign and holy hands of God it becomes the expression and proof of his righteous judgment.

Persecution, when it is an expression of man's unbelief it is sin. At the same time, it can be an expression of God's judgment, and it is righteous.

It is hard for us to grasp. Does God really want his people to be persecuted and suffer? Whether the answer is yes or no, we do know that God does not want anyone to be punished with everlasting destruction and shut out from the presence of Him and from the glory of his might. As he is a perfectly righteous and just God, this is what must happen to those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus.

God allows us to be persecuted and suffer to show, as Paul says, that we are worthy of his calling. In the last days, those who do not obey God, and Paul is particularly thinking about those who persecute Christians, will face the consequences of their sin, and will receive their judgement.

On the other hand, those who have persevered through the persecution that God has allowed, will have brought to fruition their every desire for goodness and their every deed prompted by faith. Christians who in their faithful desire for righteousness and have persevered the sin they constantly prayed that the world be delivered from, will have their prayers answered, through God's grace.

My prayer for Cooma, as you grow in faith and love, is the same as Paul's prayer for Thessalonika, that God may make you worthy of his calling, and that by his power he may bring to fruition your every desire for goodness and your

every deed prompted by faith. I do not pray that you will be perfect, that you will never sin, or that you will reach the necessary holiness by your own strength, because I know that that is humanly impossible.

My prayer that your worthiness is realised through faith in Jesus's holiness, a holiness imputed to you through his death and resurrection on your behalf. I do pray that you persevere in your faith through all the trials and temptations that God allows to come your way, and with the strength Jesus gives you through his Holy Spirit.

Like Paul, I pray that you believe my, and Paul's testimony to you, and that faith in it is growing more and more, and the love all of you have for one another is increasing. If this is so, then you will be worthy of God's calling, and the name of our Lord Jesus will be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.
