Sermon - Paul's Prayer Question Time

The Apostles Creed

Sermon - 2 Thess 3:1-5 - Paul's Prayer

Often when I lead church services, I ask people for prayer points. I ask the congregation what they would like me to pray for in the intercessions. I do this so I can pray for the things that are on your hearts, not just for the things I think I should pray about for you.

In today's reading from 2 Thessalonians, Paul shares with us his prayer points. He asks us to pray

'That the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honoured, just as it was with the Thessalonians.'

You may recall that Paul wrote this letter within about 15 to 20 years after Jesus was crucified, and it was critical for the growth of the early church that his gospel spread quickly and be honoured. Paul's missionary journeys played a big part in the early growth, but Paul's commitment to the spread of the gospel make it no surprise that he asks for prayer that the gospel spread rapidly.

Of course, for Paul, gospel spreading is not an end in itself. The spread of the good news of Jesus death and resurrection for our sins is an act of worshipping God - it proclaims the justice, righteousness and power of God by proclaiming what he has done for us. The more immediate benefit to us is that people believe and put their trust in Jesus's blood for their salvation, which is the ultimate worship of God.

As Paul says in Romans 10.13 and 14: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."but 14 "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" Have no doubt, people need to hear the gospel to put their faith in God and be saved.

And this is why Paul asks the Thessalonians (and us) to pray that the gospel, the message of the Lord, spreads rapidly, so that those who hear it can call on the name of Jesus and be saved.

That is also why I ask you to pray for the rapid spread of the gospel in Cooma and the wider Monaro. I ask you to pray this, no matter who is proclaiming it, that people around us, our families, our friends and our neighbours, may believe, may call on the name of Jesus and be saved. Will you pray for this with me?

Paul also asks the Thessalonians, and us, that we may be delivered from wicked and evil people, 'for not everyone has faith.' By including the phrase 'for not everyone has faith' suggests that he it's talking about people in the church - after all, we only expect people in the church to have faith, so by saying that no all do suggests he is talking about people who claim to be members of the church, but really aren't. Paul says that such non-believers in the church are a real danger because they don't preach the true gospel themselves, and worse, they hinder those who are trying to preach the gospel by finding ways to distract them. They actively seek to prevent Christians proclaiming the gospel by ridiculing them, and they also distract people from the truth by endless arguments about trivialities

Even though the wicked and evil people Paul is referring to are in the church, the people around us in our churches may not seem that wicked and evil. I must say that as I look over you this morning that I can't detect a hint of evil or wickedness - although if I am missing something, please feel free to bring it to my attention later! But nevertheless the devil is undoubtedly wandering around and among us trying to prevent us truly worshiping God. In this context, that means preventing the gospel being proclaimed. Anything that prevents the gospel being proclaimed, either by enticing us to worship something else, or simply by distracting us from preaching with the worries of this world, is ultimately evil and wicked.

It is no surprise that Paul wants to be delivered from these evil and wicked people. These people, in preventing the gospel being preached, are in effect stealing salvation from those who would gain it trusting in the gospel Paul, his companions and Christians today preach. It may seem that arguing technicalities or trying to ensure absolute precision in how the gospel is described is important, but it is nowhere near as important as the eternal life

that the gospel brings. Professional theologians can argue details between themselves, but what we need is a simple faith in the simple, but reliable gospel. We need to put our faith, not in our own works or efforts, but in Jesus' death and resurrection for us which is the simple message of the gospel.

That is why Paul asks us to pray that preachers be delivered from evil and wicked people who would hold the gospel back. He asks this with confidence because he knows that, as verses 3 and 4 say, that the Lord is faithful, and he will strengthen us and protect us from the evil one, the one who is really behind the evil and wicked people who are hindering the gospel.

Paul has confidence in the Lord that we are doing and will continue to do the things he commands, and he prays, as I do, that the Lord may direct our hearts into God's love and Christ's perseverance.

Now, when we have our intercessions this morning, I will ask you your prayer points, for the things on your hearts that you would like us to pray for as we pray for the church and the world, but right now, will you join me in Paul's prayer, please join me with an Amen when I finish praying Paul's words:

Please pray with me:

Brothers and sisters, we pray that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was amongst us. We pray that we may be delivered from wicked and evil people, for not everyone has faith. You Lord are faithful, and we pray that you will strengthen us and protect us from the evil one. We praise you that we have confidence in the Lord that we are doing and will continue to do the things your word through Paul commands, and in all things, May the Lord direct our hearts into God's love and Christ's perseverance. And the people said:

Amen!
