Sermon - Genesis 2 - Why are we here? Introduction

Why are you here? Atheists says chance.

The Bible (such as Acts 17.27: God put us here for a purpose, that we should inhabit the whole earth; so that we would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us). Genesis 2, today's reading, tells us more about it

Last week, Gen 1 said we are part of God's creation. This is absolutely true, but humans are more, we are made in the image of God. This introduces an important theme in theology, that of diversity in unity. For example, humans have a unity with the rest of created order, but we are also different. The key principle of the Trinity is that there is unity and diversity within God - unity of father, son and holy spirit as God, but diversity as each person of the trinity is distinct. Time and again we see this diversity in unity principle in the Bible - we are all one in Christ, we all have a unity as Christians and so there is no Jew, no Greek, no male, no female - but there are, there is real diversity, we are all different, and some differences are very important.

Mankind and creation

Noting our unity and diversity with creation, why did God put us here on this earth? Verse 5 says that at least part of the reason is to work, and in particular to work the ground, because there was no one else to do that before God put man here. The word for work is the same word that is used of God creating the universe - back in verse 2, God rested from his work of creation, the same word used here of mankind working the land. It is very important to note that God did not only put us here to work the earth, but verse 15 says we are also to look after it, to take care of it. The word is probably closer to protect the land, the same word he uses about the angels with a flaming sword who protected the garden of Eden from Adam and Eve returning after they had been cast out. Despite Christians being accused of wantonly contributing to the destruction of the environment in the name of working the land, the Bible is clear that we supposed to care for it, to protect it. Perhaps we do damage the environment, but we shouldn't!

God also gave mankind the responsibility of naming all the living creatures. This is part and parcel of mankind's dominion over all living creatures: we get to choose their names and we have responsibility for protecting them.

Freedoms v16

Along with these responsibilities, caring, protecting and naming creation, God gave Adam and Eve certain freedoms. We could eat from any fruit in the garden, except for one. When you consider the enormous number of things we can do, the thousands of choices we can make at any moment, God has given us an incredible amount of freedom. We'll get to boundaries in a moment, but God gives us freedom to largely live the way we want to live, albeit within the relatively few boundaries he has established. We do have the imperative to be wise, however, because the consequences of foolish actions can be quite severe, even if the actions themselves are not of themselves wrong.

Boundaries v17

As I mentioned with this freedom, there are also boundaries, Adam and Eve could eat from any tree except one. This model, freedom with boundaries Is the model for God's rule of this world. We shouldn't expect to be told everything we are supposed to do, any more than to think God has a detailed step by step plan for every moment of our lives. No, we have freedom within boundaries. It's important, and we'll come back to this in a moment with a specific example.

Humankind's relationship with humankind

When we get to verse 18, Adam, as the first human being, is all alone on earth. God sees that it is not good for a human being to be alone, and he brings all the living creatures to Adam to name. God did not expect that any animal would be a suitable companion for him, but he probably wanted Adam to see that for himself.

God knows that there has to be unity and diversity in human relationships. True relationships must involve two humans, because as much as my dog and I have a good relationship, it is fundamentally different from my relationship with Cath, my wife. But there is also diversity within my relationship with Cath, I am male and she is female, and this is the ideal that God has planned. Life long, committed relationships between Christians should include unity and diversity, as there was between Adam and Eve. As we read, God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, This demonstrated their unity, 23 The man said, "This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman,' for she was taken out of man." The demonstrated diversity, because not only are they male and female, they leave different families of origin to be united to each other, which Genesis describes as one flesh. They cannot be united if they did not have diversity in the first place and this is the way God has planned it.

Marriage v24,25, Eph5

This brings us to the subject of marriage, and the example of freedom within boundaries in marriage.

I know that many single people bemoan what they see as the rigid boundaries that Christian's seem to place on marriage. Many young Christians don't see why they should only marry another Christian. But, according to the Bible, if you are not married you can marry absolutely any one you like - provided they are of the opposite sex, they're not married, not a close blood relative, and if you are a Christian, they are a Christian as well. By my calculations, that gives single Christian men about 450 million girls to choose from, and single Christian women roughly the same number of men. That seems a pretty big choice. Now, some of those won't be of marriageable age, some live so far away that you'll never meet them and some won't be psychologically compatible with you, but it seems that God gives you a huge amount of freedom in that particular area. That's why wisdom comes into play: you should marry someone who helps you lead the most God honouring life, and you can help to do likewise, so actually caring about each other, even loving each other is a good idea, but even more importantly, how you are married: that you continually

work at these things, seeking to make your spouse holy, washing them in God's word, as as your marriage vows say, in sickness and in health, for richer, for poorer and so on. That's the most important thing for marriage!

No shame v25

This brings us to the last phrase in our passage: Adam and his wife were both naked, and they felt no shame. This is another example of freedom within boundaries: there is nothing wrong with the human body, but it should only be fully displayed within the proper context, that is, within the marriage relationship. Properly exercised, with love and gentleness, the sexual relationship within marriage is a good thing. However, pornography is outside the boundary that God has set, and is never appropriate for the Christian.

Application: The value of work and human relationships

God put mankind on earth to work, including to work at looking after his creation. There are freedoms and boundaries in our work, but ultimately work is good. I understand many of you have retired from a lifetime of paid work, but there is still work to be done: caring for families, friends and neighbours, and so on. Work has value, and so does the weekly rest that God commanded. I know most of you do work, and it is important to remember the value of work. It is why we are here.

Secondly, we need to remember the God ordained importance of human relationships, and particularly the marriage relationship. God said it is not good for humans to be alone, and this includes men and women. Humans are social creatures, although circumstances sometimes mean that some people aren't in marriage relationships, because they never got married, or their marriage ended through divorce or because one partner died. Churches like ours have a particular responsibility to these people, because we see the church, all of us, as Jesus's bride, as our Ephesians reading told us. Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her on the cross, and we need to be like minded to those around us.. And we even need to care for those outside the church, our gospel tells us to love our enemies.

Conclusion

God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, made mankind, men and women, in their own image to look after this wonderful creation he has made, and for relationship with each other and him. We have lost so much of the beauty of creation and the joy in our relationships with each other and God through sin in the fall, which we will talk about next week.

Even so, as Christians who know the goodness of God, we need to do our bit to care for creation and for each other. We need to show our love for God, his creation and each other he showed for us by dying on the cross.

Is this the love you are trying to show?
