Sermon - Genesis 3 - Good, Bad or Idiots

Introduction

Are people good, bad or idiots?

As many of you know, I was on a Navy training course for the last few weeks. At one point, the instructor asked us whether we thought that most people were good, bad or idiots. Rather than embarrassing anyone, I won't ask what you think, but instead, put your hand up if you think most students thought most people were idiots? Bad? Good? Actually, most students thought that most people were good, slightly less thought people were idiots, and very few thought most people were bad. You may not know me very well, but what do you think I thought?

In fact, I was the only one who said most people were bad, a couple of doctors and nurses (and a few others) thought most people were idiots, and just over half thought most people were good. What would you have said if you were on the course?

Over the last 2 weeks as we have looked at Genesis 1 and 2, we read time and again that God looked at the world he had made and saw that it was good. In fact, the only thing that wasn't good was for Adam to be alone, and even this was fixed once God made the woman. You will also remember that God gave Adam and Eve a huge amount of freedom - they could eat from any tree in the garden, but with few boundaries - they couldn't eat from the tree of life.

This week however, evil starts to creep into the world.

You might think that the eternal, all knowing, all powerful God who lovingly made this world might have a pretty good idea of how it should work. You might even think that the perfectly just and righteous God who made his perfectly good world would understand the difference between right and wrong, good and evil.

Yet it was as doubt was cast on God's goodness that evil and lies entered the good world, and we have been paying the consequences ever since.

The Fall

Things went south with the Serpent who was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made, said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?"

The Book of Revelation says that the ancient serpent is called the devil, or Satan, who leads the whole world astray. Revelation 12:9. The name Satan can be translated deceiver, and that is how he acts, both in Eden and ever since.

Note that he starts by simply laying doubts in Eve's mind: Did God really say you must not eat from any tree in the garden. As I mentioned earlier, this is a half truth: God indeed did say it, be he also added - "except the tree of life." Eve knows this, and she replies:

'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.'" Genesis 3:3

Even this doesn't deter the serpent, who continued on, presenting disobedience to God as a favourable outcome, and compounding his lie by suggesting that God didn't have Eve's best interest at heart: "You will not certainly die," the serpent said to the woman. ⁵ "For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." Genesis 3:4-5 The serpent down played their death by suggesting that the only reason that God did not want them to eat it was because he didn't want them to become like himself, and to be honest, no created being, no creature is like God, and none should be.

Nevertheless, with this prompting, the woman decided that she likes the look of the forbidden fruit, she thought that it would make her smarter, so she ate and shared it with Adam. Do you see how just a few deceitful words, subtly twisted God's truth, made him out to be the bad guy led to Adam and Eve's downfall from the most perfect environment ever. Had they just worked within the very few boundaries that God had set, where streams watered the whole surface of the ground, all kinds of other good fruit trees grew, and good things like gold, aromatic resin and precious stones were plentiful. The little work they had to do was not harsh, and they ruled over livestock and wild animals.

Consequences

The consequences of disobeying God were immediate. The first to go was the perfect, shameless relationship that Adam and Eve enjoyed. They were now ashamed, hiding themselves behind fig leaves, and even worse, trying to hide from God.

Adam's response when God confronts him with his sin is telling. Adam clearly demonstrates the broken relationships that now exist between humanity, the rest of creation and God. When God asks: Have you eaten from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from? "Genesis 3:11 he immediately tries to ship the blame from himself: Firstly showing the broken relationship within humanity, in fact within his marriage: "The woman you put here with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it." Gen 3:12

Then Eve blames creation: the serpent deceived me, and I ate.

But did you notice how Adam subtly tries to shift the blame on to God himself, he didn't just say that Eve gave him the fruit, it was the woman - who you put here with me.

As with every sin, the consequences flowed beyond just the immediate consequences, the fouled relationships. God brought judgement into the world:

The serpent was cursed to crawl on its belly in the dust.

The woman now had to endure pains in child bearing and labour, which I am sure every mother here can attest to, and a conflicted marriage relationship - she desires her husband who often rules over harshly.

Adam now finds that the pleasant work he was created for has now become harsh and painful. There are weeds and thorns, and work requires sweat and pain, and disappointments.

Worst of all, from then on, all creation was subject to death. Every creature, including mankind will die and return to the ground from which they were taken. For dust they are, and to dust they will return. Thus they were banished from Eden, from paradise and the tree of life, which was protected by cherubim, terrifying winged creatures with flaming swords. Adam and Eve, and all creatures were driven out, left to endure the results of their broken relationships with each other, with creation and with God.

Hope

Despite this harsh judgment, did you notice the brief note of hope? Sin, as personified in the serpent, had caused them to be cast out, but in judging the serpent, God promises that the serpent, and ultimately sin, will one day be destroyed by an offspring of the woman. God said: ¹⁵ And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring (or your seed) and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel." Genesis 3:15

In Romans 16, Paul encourages the Romans by saying that the God of peace will crush Satan under their feet, and in our reading from Hebrews, we read that Jesus shared in our humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil — 15 and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. Hebrews 2:14-15

Getting back to my original question, the Bible says in Romans that no one is good - there is no one righteous, not even one. We are all children of Adam and Eve in this respect. Rom 5:12 says that sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned. We are all bad, but we also have hope that Jesus, the offspring of Eve, has crushed the head of Satan. that we should no longer be slaves to sin — and if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. Rom 6:8

We may all be bad, but let us not compound that with the idiocy of rejecting God's good gift, the gift of eternal life in the perfectly restored paradise, in perfect relationship with each other, creation, and God through the death and resurrection of Jesus, the offspring of Eve, and truly be seen as good through him.
