John 4:1-26

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

¹Now Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard that he was gaining and baptizing more disciples than John - ² although in fact it was not Jesus who baptized, but his disciples. ³ So he left Judea and went back once more to Galilee. ⁴ Now he had to go through Samaria. ⁵ So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon. ⁷ When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" ⁸ (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.) ⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.) 10 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." 11 "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? 12 Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?" ¹³ Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." 15 The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water." 16 He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back." 17 "I have no husband," she replied. Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. 18 The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true." 19 "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. 20 Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem." ²¹ "Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³ Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. ²⁴ God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth." ²⁵ The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is

coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us." ²⁶ Then Jesus declared, "I, the one speaking to you—I am he."

Sermon John 4:1-26 - Living Water

Two weeks ago, Jesus used an image for salvation that Nicodemus did not understand. Nicodemus could not understand how he could be born again.

In our gospel reading today, Jesus uses a different image for salvation, living water, that the Samaritan woman did not understand either.

Before we look at this, we need to put it into context. Jesus had left Judea for Galilee, and passed through Samaritan territory. Jews and Samaritans really didn't get on, as we see a few times in the gospels (for example the parable of the good Samaritan), and they wouldn't normally have anything to do with each other. Most Jew travelling from Judea to Galilee would go the long way around to avoid entering Samaria.

The background to this was after the Assyrians captured Samaria [the capital of the Northern kingdom of Israel] in 722-21 BC, they deported all the Israelites of substance and settled the land with foreigners, who intermarried with the surviving Israelites and adhered to some form of their ancient religion (2 Kings 17-18). After the exile [of the Southern kingdom in Babylon], Jews, returning to their homeland ... viewed the Samaritans not only as the children of political rebels but as racial half-breeds whose religion was tainted by various unacceptable elements. Also, about 400 BC the Samarians erected a rival temple on Mount Gerizim.

So, despite this, Jesus enters Samaria, and then, to make things worse, he stops to chat with a disreputable Samaritan woman, and asks her to get him a drink from the well with her bucket.

Jesus knew she had a bad reputation, having five husbands and now living with a man she wasn't married to, but also she was collecting water in the heat of the middle of the day because she was too embarrassed to meet people who knew her reputation, same everyone else collected water in the cool of the morning or evening.

When asked for a drink, the woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" and Jesus answered

"If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." The woman obviously doesn't understand this idea of living water, even when Jesus tells her "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, 14 but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Now she is really confused, she wants this living water so she doesn't have to keep drawing water from the well, which leads Jesus into a discussion about her marital status.

However, before we move on, there are five things Jesus says about the water that he offers the Samaritan woman, and that he offers you today.

Firstly, It's the gift of God (verse 10: "If you knew the gift of God"). Ephesians 2:8-9 tells us 8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith —and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. You can't do anything to deserve this gift, this living water

Secondly, It's living water (verse 1b: "He would have given you living water"). Our old testament reading this morning from Jeremiah describes God as the spring of living water that heals us and saves us.

Thirdly, If you drink it, you never thirst again—that is, it's always there to satisfy you when your longing soul is thirsty (verse 14: "Whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again"). This speaks to God's loving faithfulness

Fourthly, this water becomes a spring—a well of water (verse 14: "The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water"). That's why you never get thirsty again—not because one drink is enough, but because one true drink produces a well for an eternity of drinks.

And finally, this water gives eternal life (verse 14: "... a spring of water welling up to eternal life."). Our reading from revelation is talking about eternal life when 16 'Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. When the sun will not beat down on them,' nor any scorching heat. For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; 'he will lead them to springs of living water.'

For as Jesus went on to say to the woman "a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. 24 God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth." Worshipping God is not about which mountain you are on. It doesn't matter if you are on Mount Zion, Mount Gerazim, or even Mount Kosciusko.

The woman said she knew that Messiah, the Christ, was coming and Jesus declared, "I, the one speaking to you—I am he."

In talking to the woman, Jesus had moved from saying he is the living water in verses 1-15, the prophet verses 16-19, the Saviour who makes true spiritual worship possible in verses 20-24 and in verses 25-26 that he is the Messiah. I have primarily focused today on him being there living water, but in reality Jesus is all these things: living water, prophet, saviour and Messiah. I said earlier that it didn't matter which mountain we worship on, but what does matter is who we worship, that we worship Jesus, the living water, the prophet, the saviour and the Messiah in the spirit and in truth.

Do you worship Jesus in the spirit and in truth?
