JOHN 4:27-42

²⁷ Just then his disciples returned and were surprised to find him talking with a woman. But no one asked, "What do you want?" or "Why are you talking with her?" ²⁸ Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to the town and said to the people, ²⁹ "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" ³⁰ They came out of the town and made their way toward him. ³¹ Meanwhile his disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat something." 32 But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you know nothing about." 33 Then his disciples said to each other, "Could someone have brought him food?" 34 "My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. 35 Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. ³⁶ Even now the one who reaps draws a wage and harvests a crop for eternal life, so that the sower and the reaper may be glad together. ³⁷ Thus the saying 'One sows and another reaps' is true. ³⁸ I sent you to reap what you have not worked for. Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labor." ³⁹ Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me everything I ever did." ⁴⁰ So when the Samaritans came to him, they urged him to stay with them, and he stayed two days. ⁴¹ And because of his words many more became believers. ⁴² They said to the woman, "We no longer believe just because of what you said; now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the Savior of the world."

The Apostles Creed

Sermon - John 4: 27-42- Is this the Christ

How excited is that woman?

It is so unlike most of our experiences

She has just been called out as an adulterer and totally unworthy

And she responds with praising Jesus to the people in her town

Something miraculous has happened here

In her mind she asks the question - Is this the Christ?

The way John uses this little phrase, He is making the reader, You and me ask, Is this the Christ?

And you and I the reader Are supposed to answer that question with a resounding Yes.

Because we have read about him from the beginning of the book We have been told that he is The Word incarnate We have been told that John the Baptist is not the Christ And that Jesus is the Christ

So in this little phrase "Is this the Christ?" You and I get asked, well, is he?

And as we engage with the text, as we follow the characters we see Two differing responses:

The Samaritan woman - Who declares Jesus

And the disciples - who are confused

Confusion for the disciples is a dominant theme in the Gospels

I find this one of the endearing facets of the gospels

The gospels are written by the disciples Who are confused They do not try to hide their confusion In a sense they embrace it as they write about it Because ultimately they know that Truth about Jesus is a revealed truth Through the work of the Holy Spirit

The way they write, they wish to convey the tension of a slow revelation of the person of Christ

People who meet him respond in ways that seem out of the ordinary

That's the idea behind Jesus parable about the harvest Jesus work is His declaration of Himself And the crop is people's response to him

This Samaritan woman is at the beginning of the harvest for the book of John

One of the first people to declare that Jesus is the Christ

The idea being that a picture is being built of Jesus the Christ Who is on about his fathers business

At the moment his disciples seem to only be thinking about the immediate
They have just trudged into town to get some dinner
And Jesus says he already has food
They are confused
You can imagine them saying So why did we walk so far?

However, Jesus wants to show them a more important lesson than daily bread To do the will of the father is of the upmost importance

It echoes Deut 8:3

3 He humbled you, causing you to hunger and then feeding you with manna, which neither you nor your fathers had known, to teach you that man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD.

The lesson of discipleship for today is

Like the woman who asked for living water,
Jesus introduces us to the desire for true substance

Which is to do the will of the father
To listen to the father
And then respond rightly

True spiritual food is the Words of God
This is an important lesson for the disciple

Yes you may feed and clothe yourself
Yes you may be able to choose that which is fleeting Thai or Chinese

But like normal water that doesn't quench your thirst eternally

So to we the disciple need to hunger for Spiritual food

The Words of God

Friends have you thought about your appetite

Have you thought about what you are feeding yourself

Have you thought about your discipleship
Have you thought through gaining your substance from Jesus

Make it your desire to feed on him On his word In church come regularly $\frac{3}{4}$ Or a home group, Join one

On your own private reading

Feast on God's good word, It will sustain you
