Sermon - Jesus is equal with the Father

The Apostles Creed

Sermon - John 5:16-30 Jesus is equal with the Father

Today, Jesus gets his first chance to explain himself to the Jewish leaders. They were starting to persecute Jesus because they had learnt that he had told the paralysed man at the Bethesda pool to pick up his mat.

Of course, when I say persecute, I don't mean a bit of mild criticism. No, the Jesus leaders were serious, they were working on getting Jesus killed. They might have thought to themselves it was judicial execution - or capital punishment, but we know that the arrest and trial were a complete set up. In no way was justice given, of even given anything but the most casual mood

But that's all down the track at the time of today's reading. Jesus is making his first defence, at least that John records, and he starts by addressing the claim that they had broken the Sabbath.

Sabbath law

Most people know the fourth commandment: Exodus 20:8-11 (NIV) "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. 9 Six days you shall labor and do all your work, 10 but the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your male or female servant, nor your animals, nor any foreigner residing in your towns.

You or I might ask what carrying a sleeping mat has to do with this as it certainly wasn't work in the sense of earning money. However, the Pharisees, and theory modern day counterparts, orthodox Jews are so concerned that the don't break the commandments that they have come up with 39 categories of work that they prohibit on the Sabbath. The first of these is carrying, but other categories are burning, extinguishing, cooking, plowing, harvesting, finishing and selecting, each of which has extensive commentary about what it doesn't and doesn't include, and so what is prohibited and what is allowed on the Sabbath.

Carrying is specifically prohibited because the Jews were specifically named from carrying manna on the Sabbath during the Exodus, In Numbers, God directed Moses that a man be put to death for carrying firewood on the Sabbath, and there are numerous other old testament passages that support the law.

Despite this biblical support for the Sabbath law, the Jewish leaders found it convenient to exert some control over the population. The last thing they wanted was for anyone to suggest that the people did not need to keep the laws that they policed. This ate into their authority and had to be stopped.

Jesus's Defence

Jesus's opening argument in his defence was My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working. I suspect that Jesus expected the response, but his statement incited the leaders even more because now it wasn't just a man saying people could break their precious law, it was a man claiming to be God, or at least equal with God. Unless it was true (and they would never believe that), this was blasphemy of the highest order.

Jesus knew how much this claim upset the leaders. John tells us they were now trying all the more to kill him. Yet despite this, Jesus never backs away from it. He gives a very detailed description of how he is equal with God the Father, how they do the same things, and honouring the Son honours the father.

Firstly - Showing and Doing

Jesus said that because the Father loves the Son, he shows the Son what he does, and they do the same things. He says he and God are so united that he only does what God the Father does, and in fact, he can do nothing by himself without the Father.

Already in Jesus's ministry, they have already seen Jesus perform miracles - he has turned water into wine, and he had miraculously healed people - but Jesus says that they haven't seen anything yet - he has yet to perform even greater miracles, and he knows that when he does, they will be amazed. In particular he knows that everyone who has died will be raised from Jesus by Jesus, and this will certainly amaze everyone, because everyone will participate in it.

Secondly - both the Father and the Son give life.

Jesus says that just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so Jesus gives life to whom he is pleased to give it. Not only does this happen in the last days, when Jesus returns and all the dead are raised to life, either to eternal life with him or to eternal condemnation.

In order to do this, God has even entrusted all judgement to Jesus. God does not judge independently of Jesus, he does not judge without Jesus, but in fact,

everyone is judged based on whether the honour Jesus as the Son of God, the only saviour of the world.

Finally, Honouring the Son brings honour to the Father

This is the final point I will make regarding Jesus's defence. Jesus said God entrusted all judgment to him that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. He makes it absolutely clear when he reiterates: Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him.

This might seem a strange defence for a man being judged of heretically claiming to be equal with God, to point out three critical ways in which he is precisely that - equal with God, equal in action, equal in life giving, and equally worthy of honour.

The Jewish leaders think they are judging Jesus, and in a very real sense they are judging him rightly - except that he is not just claiming to be equal with God, which would be heresy and worthy of the death they were seeking for him. He is in actual fact, in absolute reality equal with God - in fact he is not only the Son of God, he is God the Son, equally divine, equal with the Father and Holy Spirit, and equally God.

The Jewish leaders are in fact judging themselves as Jesus explains when he says: whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life. The Jewish leaders judge themselves when they do not believe Jesus's words, because it shows they do not believe God, the one who sent Jesus. So, when Jesus returns, will not cross over from death to life, they will suffer eternal condemnation.

So finally, in conclusion, are you judging yourself like the Jewish leaders, not believing Jesus and his words, not believing God who sent him? Or do you honour Jesus, God the Son, and the one who sent him, God the Father, and on that great and Final day when Jesus returns, when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and come out, will you who have done what is good in believing in Jesus, will rise to live?

If that is not you, now is the time to do something about it, please talk to me after the service about how you too can rise to eternal life on that day.
