Exodus 16:11-18 (NIV)

- ¹¹ The LORD said to Moses, ¹² "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them, 'At twilight you will eat meat, and in the morning you will be filled with bread. Then you will know that I am the LORD your God.'"
- ¹³ That evening quail came and covered the camp, and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. ¹⁴ When the dew was gone, thin flakes like frost on the ground appeared on the desert floor. ¹⁵ When the Israelites saw it, they said to each other, "What is it?" For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, "It is the bread the LORD has given you to eat. ¹⁶ This is what the LORD has commanded: 'Everyone is to gather as much as they need. Take an omer for each person you have in your tent.'" ¹⁷ The Israelites did as they were told; some gathered much, some little. ¹⁸ And when they measured it by the omer, the one who gathered much did not have too much, and the one who gathered little did not have too little. John 6:25-59 (NIV)

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

- ²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?"
- ²⁶ Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. ²⁷ Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."

- ⁴³ "Stop grumbling among yourselves," Jesus answered. ⁴⁴ "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them up at the last day. ⁴⁵ It is written in the Prophets: 'They will all be taught by God.' Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. ⁵⁴ Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. ⁵⁵ For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. ⁵⁶ Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. ⁵⁷ Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. ⁵⁸ This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." ⁵⁹ He said this while teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum.

Sermon - John 6:25-59 - Jesus is the Bread of Life

The Apostles Creed

Sermon - John 6:35-59 - Jesus is the bread of life

Have you ever thought about what it means to have eternal life? Many non-Christians I speak with tell me they don't want to live forever because it will be boring, or some other feeble excuse. Unfortunately for them, the Bible says that the alternative to eternal life is eternal judgement. The Bible is clear that everyone will exist forever, but some will be in paradise, in perfect relation with God, creation and humanity, and the rest will still exist, but will be shut out from the good things of God, things like love, peace and the good gifts of this earth - including wine which God gave to make our hearts glad. The alternative to eternal life won't be any fun!

Two weeks ago in this sermon series from John's gospel, we read that Jesus fed the crowd of 5000 men plus women and children with good things, loaves of bread and small fish. I mentioned then, as I did last week, that he was saying more than just that he was a miraculous caterer. This week we find out what that 'more' is, what it means that Jesus is the bread of life, the only way to eternal life with God in paradise. You really can't get 'more' than that!

In today's reading, Jesus starts by criticising the crowd. He says "you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill". He tells them "Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you."

Jesus makes it absolutely clear that what are important are not physical things, bread that simply fills bellies, or just goes stale and rots. He is saying that the miracles that he had done, the multiplication of the loaves and fish, the healings, the walking on the water were not important because of their physical outcomes - the full bellies, the healed bodies and so on. They are important because they are signs; they point to more important things than themselves. The crowds had seen the signs Jesus had performed, and they wanted to see more, but Jesus is saying they are only important for what they point to. The miracles, the signs don't point not to anything physical, but to eternal life. Jesus, in giving the signs, is pointing to the ultimate reality, that he is really offering eternal life. He

himself is the bread of life, and he himself will be offered up like sacrificial bread so that all may have eternal life.

What is the bread of life?

So, the first thing we need to understand is what Jesus means by the bread of life. Jesus calls the food that he offers 'Food that endures to eternal life'. So, the first aspect of this bread is that it endures. Unlike physical bread that goes stale and rots. Jesus is saying that the bread of life, that he himself, endures, he is eternal. Short lived bread cannot feed life that goes on forever. It has to be something - or someone - who himself will last forever. Jesus knows that he will rise to eternal life, never to die again, and he will endure this so that we too may rise from death to eternal life.

And Jesus will not only live to eternity, he has lived from eternity. Jesus has lived from before time, because with God the father and the Holy Spirit in trinity he created time and the whole universe. Jesus himself is divine, he is God and completely eternal. Normal bread only sustains for a short time, and divine, eternal bread is required to sustain you eternally.

Being eternal, the bread of life cannot come from this created order, because everything in this created order is temporary. Physicists tell us that literally everything in the physical world eventually wears out because of entropy, but Jesus says the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world. Jesus has come down from heaven and gives us this life, and he is this bread of life.

Then, after all this picture language, Jesus is explicit. He declares, "I am the bread of life." He is saying he didn't come just to give bread, but to be bread, to be the bread that gives eternal life.

How do we get the bread of life?

Now, since Jesus is the bread of life, the question is how do we, today, 2000 years later, the other side of the world, we who don't see the physical, bodily Jesus hanging out on mountains handing out bread rolls and fish, get this bread of life?

Jesus says that the son of man, that is, he himself will give eternal life to you as a gift. The only thing we need to do to gain it is to believe in himself, the one whom God the father sent. If we just believe in Jesus, God the Father in effect gives you to Jesus, you will come to Him. He says

that whoever comes to him he will never drive away. He goes on to say that everyone who looks to the Son, whoever looks to himself, and believes in him shall have eternal life, and he will raise them up at the last day.

So all we need to do to receive eternal life is to believe Jesus, the bread of life. There are no works, nothing we have to do except put our faith in Jesus. If you believe in Jesus, you will have eternal life, you will be raised on the last day to eternal life the way God intended life to be, in perfect relationship with Him, with each other and with the world.

It is also not just 'a' way to eternal life, it is the 'only' way. Jesus says in John 14:6 "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." This complements verse 44 in which Jesus says "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them." So the Father draws us to Jesus, and Jesus is the only way to the Father - to the eternal life in perfect relationship with him that Jesus promised.

What are the consequences of eating the bread of life?

The final question we must ask ourselves today, is what is this eternal life? Or, putting it another way, what are the consequences of believing in Jesus?

Jesus says that 'Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.' Since Jesus had made it plain he is not talking about physical food, it is clear that he is not talking about physical hunger or thirst, but spiritual hunger and thirst. No one who believes in Jesus will ever be spiritually hungry or thirsty. This will no longer happen in this world or the world to come, in the eternal life that Christ grants you. Those who trust in Jesus will never long for spiritual realities - for being fed the real spiritual food and drink that truly gives life, for true fellowship with God, for mystically being in God, and God in you, for the sure hope of resurrection on the last day.

We also eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, and so have true life within us. Jesus is referring to the Eucharist or Holy Communion, indicating a deep spiritual truth about participating in His life and sacrifice. He is foreshadowing the Last Supper, where Jesus institutes the New Covenant in His blood. It also connects to the spiritual unity all Christians have together, as 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 tells us¹⁶ Is not the

cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? ¹⁷ Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf.

Conclusion

As I have been saying in this series from John's gospel, Jesus is so much more than he appears at first glance. He is so much more than an extravagant caterer who fills our bellies with physical bread that will leave us hungry in a short time. He is so much more than the giver of bread, he is the Bread of eternal life.

As we celebrate the Lord's Supper shortly, we will pray that by God's Word and Holy Spirit we will eat and drink of the bread and the wine and partake of Christ's body and blood, and celebrate Jesus's one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world, renewing each of us by God's Holy Spirit in the unity of Christ's body, and bringing us into the joy of God's eternal kingdom, where in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit we will worship God the Father in songs of never ending praise.

As we do this, let us remind ourselves again that Jesus is so much more than the giver of bread, he IS the Bread of eternal life. Remember that we only get eternal life through Jesus, and the consequences of partaking of Jesus the bread of life for our relationship with God - being in him and him in us, and our relationship with all other Christians - being one together as Christ's body, and our relationship with God's creation - having the sure hope of eternal life in perfect harmony with all of God's creation as God intended - worshipping him, in Christ, and Christ in us, living forever. Let us remember that Jesus is this bread of eternal life.
