Job 11:7–19

⁷"Can you fathom the mysteries of God? Can you probe the limits of the Almighty? ⁸ They are higher than the heavens above—what can you do? Sermon - The Mystery of Christ

Introduction

Last week we talked a lot about how Christ has joined us gentiles to the Jews as God's people.

Verses 1-13 of today's reading calls this the great mystery - that is, something once hidden but now revealed. In this chapter, Paul also tells us that God gave him the job of preaching this mystery to the gentiles: It says: I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. 8 Although I am less than the least of all the Lord's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, 9 and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things.

Note how honoured Paul seems to be with this job: even though Paul considers himself less than the least of all the Lord's people, for him it was a gift of grace, given through the working of God's power, and the mystery is the boundless riches of Christ. I wonder how often we see the responsibility of sharing Christ in this way?

Because of course, this job is not only Paul's but the whole church's. Paul goes on to say:

10 God's intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, 11 according to his eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. 12 In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence.

It is our, the church's responsibility to let the world know that through Jesus we can directly approach God, with freedom and confidence. This is surely the greatest news that anyone can hear, and it is our job to share it. Are you joining with Paul and all other Christians in this essential task?

Paul realises that for us, as it was for him, there will be many discouragements along the way. He didn't want his sufferings to discourage the Ephesians or us, and so he prayed for in the words of verses 14-21.

Now this may be one of the shortest sermons you will ever hear, at least from me, but today, I want to follow it with one of the longest prayers you will hear from me, a prayer in Paul's example, praying for every member of Cooma Anglican with Paul's words. Will you join me in this prayer for your family, friends and neighbours?
